

- Depending on the culture, dragons are rare and can possess many different kinds of powers, or it could also be that they do not have any power at all. They also have various animal features, such as elephant heads, lion claws and bird beaks. They have earthly colors, such as green, blue, red and gold, which pertains to various meanings.



- In India, they have a dragon called Vritra or Vrtra.
- In Bhutan, they have Druk or the Thunder Dragon.
- In Europe, dragons existed in folk civilizations relating to the Balkans and the Western Asian mythological creatures. These are reptiles with wings and four legs.
- In the Southern part of Europe, a Greek dragon was first mentioned in the Iliad, where the character named Agamemnon had a belt with a blue dragon and a dragon emblem with 3 heads.
- In the Eastern part of Europe, the word zmey is pertaining to a dragon in Slavic mythology, which also means snake. In Russia and Ukraine, they have a fire-dragon with 3 heads and named Zmey Gorynych.
